90%	Great going; but lets focus on which IT section needs improvement.
80%	Not bad, have a meeting with your IT Team and discuss the weak points.
70%	Information, sensitive data and data recovery at risk.
60 %	Network extremely vulnerable to data loss, hardship on recovering from a disaster.
50%	Send your IT support team to training or consider another IT company.
40%	Risky chance of recovery hardship, data loss, system exposure.
30%	At Risk. Extreme recovery hardship. Potential loss of data.
20%	We recommend a computer class, online or at a local college.
10%	Unplug your network from the world. You would be much safer with paper and pencil.

1. Account Security (10 pts each)

- a. Modem password and configuration documented and backed up.
- b. Router password and configuration (VPN, VNC, port forwarding, RDC) documented and backed up.
- c. All administrator, account user names and passwords. Documented and stored.
- d. Firewalls or anti-virus programs active and up-to-date.
- e. Company Email and/or WEB site: URL Control Panel, administrator account name, user names and passwords documented and securely stored.
- f. 5 pt. BONUS [Wi-Fi] Secured with WEP, WPA or some other protocol.

2. <u>Data Protection (10 pts each)</u>

- a. Data and configuration backups of your server files (and PC Clients) are kept offsite or in cloud storage.
- b. Daily, weekly, monthly and yearly backup routines.
- c. 5 pt. BONUS: Each PC has an Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS)? Not a surge protector.

3. "Pro-Active" Maintenance (10 pts each)

- a. [Windows] Operating Systems "OS" up-to-date on all PC's.
- b. Most PC and servers today run 24/7. Do you exercise (power off- power on) each machine monthly, quarterly or yearly? NOTE: This is not due to a power outage.
- c. *5 pt. BONUS*: Is each PC physically cleaned yearly? (Dust creates heat; heat kills all PC's components motherboard, hard drive, power supply, CD/DVD reader/writer).

4. General Documentation (10 pts)

a. Are all the PC (laptops, towers) documented for: Serial numbers, Windows COA, CPU, CPU speed, RAM memory, hard disk drive size and main applications.
